Title of the Practice: Savitribai Phule Dattak Palak Yojana. i.e. Adopting the Students.

Goal: Our college started Savitribai Phule Students Adoption scheme.

The Context: The girl students of our college are mostly from rural area. Due to problems and narrow mentality of society towards higher education of girl child, they cannot get education properly. Hence College staff including teaching, non-teaching and class four decided to adopt girl students at initial stage of their higher education by providing them all required encouragement and support to study. Parents being from rural and poor background need to be convinced and counselled regarding the importance of education. So our college has taken the responsibility for educational development of the students. Our college had started the door to door counselling scheme for upliftment of students. We have tried our level best to develop the students educationally strong.

The Practice: Students are divided among the faculty members equally. The faculty is shouldered the responsibility to keep in touch with the student and the parents and provide necessary guidance. Our college had conducted the above mentioned welfare scheme for upliftment of students. We have tried our level best to develop the students educationally strong. The students also feel free to contact their mentor teacher for their problems. Students even share their personal problems. The faculty try their level best to settle the problems of students. At times the parents are contacted and counselled.
